In honor of Women's History Month, we would like to highlight some nurses who have made outstanding contributions to the nursing profession.



#### Mary Brekinridge

The most important contribution Mary
Breckinridge made to nursing was her work as a
pioneer in nurse-midwifery and in the
development of modern nursing services in rural
communities. She introduced the first modern
comprehensive health care system in the United
States and provided professional services for
primary nursing care and midwifery. She also
promoted the growth of district nursing centers
and hospital facilities in southeastern Kentucky



#### **Dorthea Dix**

Dorothea Dix was an early 19th century activist who drastically changed the medical field during her lifetime. She championed causes for both the mentally ill and indigenous populations. By doing this work, she openly challenged 19th century notions of reform and illness. Additionally, Dix helped recruit nurses for the Union army during the Civil War. As a result, she transformed the field of nursing.



#### Mary Eliza Mahoney

Eager to encourage greater equality for African Americans and women, Mary Eliza Mahoney pursued a nursing career which supported these aims. She is noted for becoming the first African American licensed nurse.

#### Florence Wald

Florence Wald was an American nurse, former Dean of Yale School of Nursing, and largely credited as "the mother of the American hospice movement". She led the founding of Connecticut Hospice, the first hospice program in the United States.



There are a lot more powerful women who have made important advancements in the nursing field and in healthcare. Take into account the nurses whose work has directly impacted your life. Perhaps you might consider the beneficial impact of a professor from nursing school or a mentor from a previous career.

Finding inspiration from past and present nursing leaders is more crucial than ever as the nation nears the three-year anniversary of the COVID-19 pandemic's declaration and many nurses are experiencing burnout. It may inspire nurses to keep working toward their goals, hone the nursing-specific skills they require, and develop independent methods to make a difference.
