What is Intersectionality?

Intersectionality was first coined by Kimberlé Crenshaw, a Black legal scholar and social justice advocate, to describe discrimination against Black women on the basis of race as well as sex. Over the years, intersectionality has become a lens through which we can visualize the unique experiences of discrimination people encounter and how gender, race, class, sexual orientation, physical ability, etc., play a part in this equation. Due to healthcare's historical mistreatment and disregard to underserved groups, we as nurses must be knowledgeable on how these intersecting identities impact our patients and the steps we can take to ensure inclusive and equitable care is provided to all.
